There are many demand of time put on teachers. According to Article Thirteen, members may be asked to work UP TO thirty hours outside of the contractual day. The events are clearly defined as to what you can be asked to do.

- D. Outside the Normal Workday
 - Unit Members may be required to work up to thirty (30) hours a year outside the normal workday in the following areas:
 - a. Professional Development, Curriculum Development, Parent Involvement:
 - * Back to School/Open House
 - Staff Meetings Outside of the Workday School Site Councils In-Service/Curriculum Meetings District or School Meetings/Committees
 - Supervision of Co-Curricular Student Activities:
 - * Sports Activities
